#### THE COMMUNITY

Located in the heart of the Puget Sound region, scenic Bellevue is the fifth-largest city in Washington. It serves as the metropolitan center for King County, the state's most populous county. This highly desirable community spans more than 31 square miles and is home to over 149,440 residents. With the Cascade Mountains to the east and Seattle just 10 miles to the west, Bellevue is considered Seattle's largest suburb and one of the best places to live and launch a business. Bellevue is frequently named one of the 100 best places to live by Money magazine. Bellevue is ideally situated along Interstates 90 and 405 and State Route 520. In 2016, light rail transit construction began in Bellevue, with service expected to start in 2024. East Link, a voter-approved project, will extend light rail from Seattle, across Lake Washington along I-90, through Bellevue and on to Downtown Redmond.

Bellevue is culturally diverse, with about 50 percent of its population being of people of color and 42 percent speaking a language other than English at home. Asians comprise just over 34 percent of Bellevue's population, the tenth highest percentage in the nation for cities with 100,000 in population or more, and the highest percentage of large cities outside of California and Hawaii. Bellevue is an economic powerhouse. More people work in Bellevue than reside there, making it the second-largest employment center in King County. Some of the country's best-known companies – Amazon, Microsoft, T-Mobile, Salesforce, Concur, Symetra and PACCAR are located in Bellevue. Coupled with the many smaller and medium-sized businesses, they are the source of the approximately 150,000 jobs within city boundaries. Bellevue's school district ranks among the nation's top in the country. The school's athletic programs are excellent as well. Because of Bellevue's diverse population, more than 90 languages are spoken in the public schools.

The quality of life in Bellevue is exceptional. Residents and visitors can access abundant outdoor recreation by traveling to nearby Cascade Mountains or outdoor venues in the city with various activities including community and beach parks, mini-parks, trails, and botanical gardens. Located just minutes from downtown Bellevue, the Mercer Slough Nature Park is the largest of Lake Washington's remaining freshwater wetlands, with over 320 acres of wildlife habitat, agriculture, freshwater wetland ecosystems, and trails. Whether visiting one of the community farms, enjoying a round of golf, swimming at the Bellevue Aquatic Center, or catching a performance at the youth theatre or a movie in the park, there is always something to see and do in Bellevue. Popular annual events in Bellevue include the Strawberry Festival, Arts Fest, and Family July 4th celebration. The Garden d'Lights brilliant winter wonderland display at Bellevue Botanical Gardens during the holiday season is a winter tradition for families and groups around the northwest. Bellevue is described as a "City in a Park." A charming small town characterizes the city feel, featuring growing, tree-lined neighborhoods and natural beauty beyond compare. The City is noted for its environmental stewardship, award-winning park systems, and vast network of green spaces.

## **GOVERNANCE & ORGANIZATION**

The City of Bellevue recognizes that complex local government operations require strong collaborative political leadership, policy development, a relentless focus on execution and results, a commitment to transparent and ethical government, and a strategy for representing and engaging every segment of the community.

Bellevue operates under a Council/Manager form of government. The City Council is comprised of seven members, elected at-large, serving staggered four-year terms. The Council selects a Mayor and Deputy Mayor. The Council sets the general policies of the City, which the City Manager and City Staff implement.

The City provides a full range of services, including police and fire protection, the construction and maintenance of streets and other infrastructure, solid waste and water services, recreational activities, and cultural events. A \$2.2 billion budget was approved for 2023-2024 funding essential services while also making target investment to address Bellevue unprecedented growth. Due to the unprecedented growth the City will increase its employee base by 88 employees to a total of 1,540 employees.

# **LEADERSHIP & INNOVATION**

The City of Bellevue is a High-Performance Organization with core values of excellent public service, stewardship, commitment to employees, integrity, and innovation. The City of Bellevue began seeking national accreditation for its operating departments in the late 1990s. Today, Bellevue is one of just a few cities in the nation where every major operating department has earned accreditation from a respected evaluating agency.

In addition to these accreditations, the Finance Department has received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting (ACFR Program) and Distinguished Budget Award from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) every year since 1983.

The City of Bellevue is dedicated to delivering exceptional service to its residents and businesses. The City has a high-performance culture and has undertaken an organizational improvement effort called "One City." One City embraces shared leadership, collaboration, empowerment, innovation, and performance management, and the organization is committed to the program's continued success.

Bellevue conducts annual surveys of both its residents and employees. The City has enjoyed consistently high ratings even during the economic downturn – proof of the commitment of hard-working municipal employees to deliver exceptional customer service even with limited resources. Highlights of the 2022 citizen survey indicated that 91% of Bellevue residents believe that their quality of life exceeds or greatly exceeds their expectations. Nearly 86% said the quality of City services either greatly exceeds or exceeds their expectations.

The Director of Finance and Asset Management is a member of the city's executive team that advises the City Council in coordination with the City Manager's office, provides competent and inspirational leadership citywide and for the Finance and Asset Management (FAM) department, and oversees the programs and services of the department. This position reports directly to one of the Deputy City Managers in the City Manager's Office. The Director of Finance and Asset Management is expected to work collaboratively on an interdepartmental basis in partnership with fellow department directors and within the department. The director's involvement on the city's leadership team is an important component to this position
